





ZOONOTIC DISEASES

A Zoonotic Disease is one which can pass from animal to human. Although this can cover a realm of creatures from insects to cats and dogs, this article will focus specifically on ailments that can be transmitted from dog to human.

The most common of these diseases are:

Giardia – The Giardia parasite causes intestinal distress and diarrhea. It is found in dog excrement. When the contaminated feces comes in contact with a water source, soil, food products or plants, the disease can be passed to humans.

To protect yourself from contracting Giardia, it is essential that you keep your pet in top notch health including parasite screening. Clean up after your dog after he poops and make sure you thoroughly wash your hands when finished. If you are working in soil, avoid getting near your eyes, mouth and nose. Make sure all your water supplies are without contamination.

Rabies -- Rabies is transmitted via a bite from an infected animal. It can take months for symptoms to present but when they do, they will include fever, generalized achiness, confusion and neurological deterioration during the final stages.

Keep your pet's Rabies vaccinations up to date and if you see a wild animal acting strangely, keep yourself and your dog away.

Scabies – Scabies are caused by mites. If you come in direct contact with a dog who is infested with mites, you are at risk for developing Scabies. Symptoms include redness, irritation and intense itching.

To prevent Scabies, keep your dog's coat and skin clean. If you see any irritations or lesions on your dog's skin, consult your veterinarian for diagnosis and treatment.

Toxocariasis – This is caused by the common Roundworm. Dogs that are infected with this type of parasite expel eggs through their feces which can then contaminate the soil. Children playing in such soil and accidentally ingesting the soil may develop Toxocariasis.


Toxocariasis can be prevented with good hygiene and a regular deworming program, set up by your veterinarian, for your pet. In humans, toxocariasis will generally resolve itself because the larvae can't mature in a human host.

Dermatophytosis (Ringworm) – This is a fungal infection of the skin. It can be transmitted from dog to human by direct contact.

Leptospirosis – This bacterial infection is caused by contact with the urine of an infected animal such as a mouse or rat. Contaminated, stagnant water can also be a source for this disease. If a dog has this disease, it can be passed on to any human who comes in contact with their urine – usually in cleaning up after the dog. There is a vaccine for Leptospirosis so check with your veterinarian to see if it's right for your dog.

There are many different ways you can reduce zoonotic disease risks for yourself and your family. This includes practicing good hygiene around animals, taking your pets to a veterinarian for regular visits, avoiding contact with wildlife, and learning how to spot the different diseases animals can give to people.


We cook from scratch for the dogs, yet pop a ready made dinner in the microwave for ourselves.
